1. Call to Order:

The second 2018-19 District 2-E2 Lions cabinet meeting was called to order by DG Pete Koschelew at 2:04 p.m. Agenda dated October 13, 2018 (2pp.) is attached. Attendance: a quorum is confirmed. 2-e2 Lions Quest Cabinet Core 4 Grant Update.

October 13, 2018

In order to save time, a few helpful Lions are distributing hard copies of this Lions Quest report. What I want to share with you verbally will bring JOY in YOUR HEARTS, PRIDE and DETERMINATION! Beginning this school year I am thrilled to share with you that our 2-e2 LCIF Lions Quest Grants and NOVO Grant are enabling approximately 27,945 students to learn and practice the Lions Quest social and emotional skills which enable each student to meet with greater success throughout his/her life! We Have to Be Beaming!! Thank each of you for all of your support, help, advocacy, and commitment! Let's Keep Moving Forward With Enthusiasm and Commitment! God Bless Each of YOU!

In July, we received our first 2nd Core 4 Lions Quest Grant (Humanitarian Grant) disbursement of \$18,777 ($\frac{1}{4}$ of \$75,000). District 2-e2 will disburse $\frac{1}{4}$ of our \$35,000 (\$8,750). With the cost of trainers, curriculum kits, and food, our costs for August 13th – 15th should be covered.

Lions Quest Trainings:

August 13th: Sherman ISD—All of the seven elementary schools' 3rd and 4th grade educators received Lions Quest Training at Neblett Elementary, 1505 Gallagher Drive, Sherman, TX. Sue Keister and Penny Willis trained 85 educators. The curriculum cost was \$10,975 + \$215 for shipping; \$5,400 for trainers and food cost of \$924. The Sherman Noon Clubs had 6 Lions helping me: Lions David Stone, Kent Newtown, Barbara Sloan, Mignon Plyler, and Jean and Mark Barrett.

August 14th: Wilshire Elementary School—HEB ISD—All 43 of the Pre-K through 5th grade educators received Lions Quest training at their school,

420 Wilshire Drive, Euless, Texas. Dr. Stephen Dunn was the trainer. Hats off to Principal Jodie Ramos! She had the 50 staff members attending the training. The 43 curriculum kits cost \$6,450 +\$290 for shipping, and \$2,700 for the trainer. Breakfast was furnished by the school and lunch by the PTO. LCIF Lions Quest DONATED 700 student journals which at \$5 each amounted to a \$3,500 contribution. Cindy Ward from Mid-Cities Family Lions Club helped me.

August 15th: Castleberry ISD—All of the 57 educators of 6th – 8th grade students received Lions Quest Training at Irma Marsh Middle School, 415 Hagg Drive, Fort Worth. The trainers were Sue Keister and Dr. Stephen Dunn. The cost of the curriculum was \$7,500 +\$75 shipping, \$5,400 for the training, and \$547.46 for the food. Five Lions from the River Oaks Lions Club helped me: Lions Clayton and Lauris Meissner, Jim Byrom, Linda Woodham, and another lady of whom I did not get the chance to acquire her name.

August 12 – 15—I purchased snacks for all three schools and distributed them based upon the percentage of the educators at each of the trainings (\$205.47).

September 10 and 12 I will be observing Lions Quest being taught in EMS-ISD. Now we have Lions Quest Pre-K through 12th grade, so additional observers are needed.

October 12-13 During the following weeks I will be compiling the grant's first report so the remainder of the funds can be distributed to 2-e2. I will be attending the 2-e2 Fall Conference and Cabinet Meeting and submitting the first report for our second grant from LCIF, now referred to as the Humanitarian Lions Quest Grant. The LCIF requires that the report be approved by the cabinet and signed by PDG Charlie Bethards.

The business of today is to acquire our 2-e2 Cabinet's approval of our 2nd Lions Quest Grant-First Report in order to receive the remainder of the funds so we can move forward.

The other is from Everman as relayed by Stephanie. When the flood started the father ran through the house in waist high water. He got his young daughter on his shoulders. He could not figure a way out of the house because of the rising waters outside his front and back door. He went to a front bedroom and broke out the window. He was putting family members out of the window when his young son ran to his room to retrieve his backpack. Dad told him that we don't need that and he said I need my homework for school. On Monday he went to school with his wet backpack and told his teacher what happened. At lunchtime the teacher and staff went a bought him a new backpack.

LET'S USE CORRECT TERMINOLGY...

It is important to distinguish between **White Cane Safety Day** and the **White Cane**. The first term **"WHITE CANE SAFETY DAY."** refers to the special day set aside on **October 15** by the President Johnson in 1964 to celebrate the achievements of people who are blind/visually impaired and the white cane which is a tool for independence. The **White Cane Laws** followed to protect the safety of pedestrians using a white cane. Today, there is a variant of the White Cane Law on the statute books of each of the United States. The **North Texas White Cane Safety Day** committee is the group of volunteers which plans and directs an annual event in North Texas (the Fort Worth Stockyards). We do this on the Thursday closest to October 15 (this year October 18) so that school children may be bussed by their schools from all over on school busses to participate and enjoy the event (as far away as Wylie!)

Your Lions club is encouraged to make contributions to the White Cane Safety Day, i.e., the **North Texas White Cane Safety Day** Committee. Donations are tax deductible because we are managed by the **American Council of the Blind**, which is a 501 C-3 entity. Gifts of \$250 or more means your Lions club name and logo will go on the commemorative t-shirt for the event next year.

Any reference to **"WHITE CANE"** within District 2E2 refers to the **Lions Organ and Eye Bank Vision Assistance** program. This is one of our official 2E2 **"100% Entities"** and all the funds given through your club, also tax deductible, go to help fund vision assistance projects/ grants from the LOEB.
