The Albert W. & Viola Brown Humanitarian Award, a unique District 2-E2 recognition

So, you ask what is this award given out by the district 2-E2 Past District Governors Association?

First any Lion in the district who qualifies can be nominated. Past leaders of the district (District Governors), nor the District Governor leadership team (DG, 1st VDG and 2nd VDG) **ARE NOT** eligible. **Second** it recognizes Lions who participate not only at the club level, but at the district level.

The minimum requirements are 15 years as a Lion (Lion service outside the district counts) with 5 of those years participating in a 2-E2 District position. **Eligible District positions are**:

- Zone or Region Chair
- District leadership (cabinet) position
- Member of a District supported entity Board.
 - Eyeglass Recycling Center, Lions Organ & Eye Bank, Drug Awareness
 Council, Julian C Hyer, Texas Lions Camp Director, Sports Extravaganza and Lions Quest

There have been 22 recipients of the award beginning in the 2003-2004 Lions year. The first recipients were Albert and Viola Brown, for whom the award is named. For more information on Albert and Viola, visit the A&V Brown page under the "About 2-E2" section of the website.

Any Lion can nominate someone for this award beginning in

October. Ask your Club board of directors to submit the nomination to any Past District Governor for their endorsement. That District Governor will then forward the nomination to the three-member nomination committee (PDG Tom Westerman, PDG Tom Hayford and PDG Stan Hall). The nomination form must be received by the nominations committee by **Saturday December 16**th.

Once all the nominations are received all the past district governors will vote for the awardee who will be announced at the 3rd Leadership meeting, January 20th.

A Recognition Luncheon will be held by the end of March 2024, hosted by the PDG Association with input provided by the awardee and their club.
