LIONS CAMP 70th ANNIVERSARY TIMELINE

April 4, 1949 Camp Charter Filed and approved as a tax exempt corporation.

1950 Land was secured, funds of \$100,000 were raised and ground was broken September 28, 1950 and the first two bunkhouses began.

By Fall 1952 the kitchens were finished.

Camp open on schedule Sunday, June 8, 195 - by the end of the summer 236 children enjoyed a special summer camping experience.

Today 1,500 children attend Texas Lions Camp each summer. Through the years, more than 79,000 children with physical disabilities and Type 1 diabetes have discovered the delights of camp.

Most importantly, these children were afforded the opportunity to forget about their disabilities during the magic of camp.



FOCUS ON YOUTH

DIABETES AND COVID 19

With the rising number of coronavirus/COVID-19 cases, patients with diabetes and their families will have special concerns about how this may impact their health. For older adults with diabetes, it has been widely published that diabetes represents a major risk factor for complications of COVID-19.

The virus typically has a milder course in children, and the evidence available so far suggests that most children and young people with diabetes are not at a significantly higher risk of severe COVID-19 than other children and young people of the same age. However, as with other viral illnesses, there is an increased risk for ketones and even DKA if diabetes is not carefully managed. Please keep in mind that we are learning new information about this novel virus on a daily basis.

Those competing in the Youth Contests should plan to arrive no later than 8:30 AM. Please be sure to relay this message if your club is sponsoring a contestant!

There have been a number of emails being sent to Lions in our District that make unusual requests. If you receive an email with unusual requests, especially asking you to purchase something for another Lion, DELETE IT IMMEDIATELY!

Phishing? What is it?

Scammers use email or text messages to trick you into giving them your personal information. They may try to steal your passwords, account numbers, or Social Security numbers. If they get that information, they could gain access to your email, bank, or other accounts. Scammers launch thousands of phishing attacks like these every day — and they're often successful. The FBI's Internet Crime Complaint Center reported that **people lost \$57 million to phishing schemes in one year**.

Scammers often update their tactics, but there are some signs that will help you recognize a phishing email or text message.

Phishing emails and text messages may look like they're from a company you know or trust. They may look like they're from a bank, a credit card company, a social networking site, an online payment website or app, or an online store. Phishing emails and text messages often tell a story to trick you into clicking on a link or opening an attachment. They may

- say they've noticed some suspicious activity or log-in attempts
- claim there's a problem with your account or your payment information
- say you must confirm some personal information
- include a fake invoice
- want you to click on a link to make a payment
- say you're eligible to register for a government refund
- offer a coupon for free stuff
