## WUNDER WAGONS

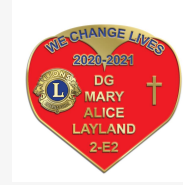
The service project for the April 9/10th Convention was to provide much needed Wunder Wagons and items to fill those wagons for Cook Children's Pediatric Cancer Program. These wagons are used to transport children around the hospital as needed. The wagons are designed with an arm that raises in the back of the wagon to hold IVs or other medical devices. The District had the wagons specially designed to look like a lion! There was a wagon on display at the Convention for all to see. The District received a grant from the Texas Lions Foundation to fund the purchase of five wagons. In addition, seven wagons were provided by the following clubs: Cleburne (2); Colleyville (1); Greater Arlington (2); Northwest Tarrant (1); Pantego (1).

Cook Children's Wish List Items were made available before the Convention so that clubs could participate by purchasing much needed items ahead of the convention. These items and cash donations were accepted at the Convention.

This is an ongoing service project and



clubs can continue their support by providing items on the hospital's wish list periodically. District 2-E2 Lions made those deliveries to Cook's on Friday, April 16th.

## THE DISTRICT GOVERNORS VISITATION PROTOCOL – DISTRICT 2-E2

The visit of the District Governor is one of the highlights of the Lions year. Certain rules of protocol apply for the official visit.

The Governor maintains a very busy schedule during the year and courtesy would suggest that the Governor be contacted, in writing, suggesting a minimum of three (3) dates for the official visit.

The Governor can be introduced by the club president or one of the cabinet officers present. This should be done with dignity and include information concerning the Governors home club, business, offices held, Lionistic activities and family, if appropriate.

**Introduction of the Governor should be done only once - when being presented to the assembly for remarks.** The Governor sits to the immediate right of the podium with the President to the immediate left. It would be suggested that thirty (30) minutes be allowed for remarks by the Governor.

The Governor is the only speaker to be scheduled for the meeting. Do not expect the Governor to compete with another speaker or with long, drawn-out business or board meetings. Usually, rules are suspended and all reports are tabled until the next regular meeting. Have an agenda to work from and start the meeting on time. Make sure all of the details are done in advance, greeters to be present, bell and banner displayed, region or zone chairs should be invited, meal planned and, if a gift is being presented, make sure it is available at the meeting.

Notify the Governor, in writing, of all special club events and extend an invitation to attend. If the Governor is expected to be a participant in the event, provide advance notification, in writing, as to the level of participation requested by the club.

When the District Governor is recognized at any Lions meeting, club or district level, all Lions should rise and remain standing until the Governor signals them to be seated. Not only is this proper protocol, it is recognition of the office.

If a club wishes the Governor to induct new members during the course of an official visit, again notify of the induction in advance and provide a list of names of new members, and their sponsors. Make sure new member kits are ready for presentation.

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### NOTE FROM THE EDITOR:

This has been a tough year for Lions throughout the world. It's time for us to increase the visibility of Lions Clubs in our District. Some of our clubs do a great job getting the information about their fundraisers, service projects, and meeting information to the public, either through their websites or other forms of social media such as Facebook. Right now Facebook is the best way to benefit Lions. There are other platforms cropping up that may be a good source of visibility as well. I will investigate those platforms to avoid getting caught up in those that are one-sided political platforms.

If your club hasn't ventured into technology visibility I would be happy to assist you in your efforts. LCI has free access to set up Lions Club websites. They are easy to learn and manage. I can help you set up a free website and a free Facebook page for your club. You will need a volunteer to help you keep those sites up to date. You want people to continue visiting those sites to discover the amazing projects Lions promote and the fun they have promoting them!

If your club prefers a different route, I propose to help you create flyers that can be posted on our 2E2 website and Facebook page. You provide the information and I will develop the flyer which will be approved by your club representative. I have a Library of Lions clip art to promote that visibility. I do my best to follow all the clubs in our District and forward postings emailed to me to our District website and Facebook page.
